OUR MISSION

Revitalizing homes, neighborhoods & lives through preservation, education and community involvement.

Founded in 1992, Revitalize CDC performs critical repairs, modifications and rehabilitation on the homes and non-profit facilities of low-income families with children, the elderly, military veterans and people with disabilities. We leverage the investments of donors, grantors and volunteers to make significant home repairs that stabilize neighborhoods, strengthen the tax base, and allow elderly homeowners to "age in place."



#GreenNFit

Rebuilding a block of homes in 1 neighborhood with the help of over 100 supporters and 1,000 volunteers all in 1 day! The program focuses on making homes energy-efficient, safe and healthy.



#JoinedForces

#JoinedForces, in partnership with businesses, civic organizations, and other non-profit agencies, the program provides veterans and their families with critical repairs and modifications on their homes.



Community Engagement

We work with residents along with local and regional collaborators to facilitate communication, interaction, and involvement to develop effective neighborhood revitalization strategies that improve the health, safety, and sustainability of our community.



DASHH

Doorway to an Accessible, Safe & Healthy Home (DASHH) improves housing conditions by performing interventions for individuals with chronic illnesses and older adults allowing them to safely remain in their home.



COVID-19 Relief

Working with Western Massachusetts Health Care Centers, we have delivered supplies and food to hundreds of individuals in quarantine or otherwise affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.
